
I hope that everyone has a great time.

Additional Notes

For members with own transportation, the Navy Exchange and Commissary for Mayport are located off base on Mayport Road. (no gate pass needed, just military I.D.)

Naval Air Station Jax has a relatively new Exchange and Commissary located on base. NAS Jax is located in Orange Park on US 17 (Roosevelt Blvd).

The major shopping and dining center in the Jax area is the St. Johns Town Center with most of the major stores and a wide range of restaurants to select.

For those looking for nostalgia, most of the bars outside of Mayport have disappeared to be replaced by motels, condos and apartment complexes. The St Johns Mayport Ferry should be back open in September after a small crash to the docking ramp in early May. But the seafood restaurants are still busy.

Dues are Due




